Dear Parishioners and Friends of All Saints, Boyne Hill,

This week I have been invited to speak at the assemblies at Altwood School on the theme of joy. Some of the questions posed by the teacher who sets the themes for the assemblies are;

- 1. What do you find joy in?
- 2. How can we share joy and happiness?

I think many of you know me well enough to know where I might find joy. Watching Wales win the Grand Slam (we are not going to win the 2023 World Cup) in rugby, enjoying a wonderful meal with Monika and friends, visiting a new country that provides different experiences. For others it might be music and a concert, or indeed noticing the small and beautiful things in creation. For those who have experienced bringing a child into the world that will most certainly bring joy. Equally, it might be through the second question when we find joy through sharing compassion and happiness with others.

How we share joy is a powerful message. Desmond Tutu and Dala Lama in both a book and in a television interview showed how even in suffering, joy can be found through humour and compassion. The television presenter Gaby Roslin has written a book 'Spread the Joy'. I listened to a small section of an interview with her last week and she described how at home, running errands, at work, on your morning stroll, you can notice opportunities to appreciate life and find joyful moments.

Sharing joy is an important message. I found an assembly yesterday online (assemblies.org.uk) Pause for Thought: Joy in kindness by Rebecca Parkin. I am hoping that Altwood find the three-minute animation of a man fishing with his little dog in the back of the boat. The man is focussed on the fishing and the dog seems to have made its mission to keep an annoying stork from stealing the worms to catch the fish. Every time the stork comes to steal, the dog gets more and more annoyed with the stalk, while the fisherman, not noticing what is going on behind him gets more and more irritable with his dog for frightening off the fish! The poor dog is in despair as the stork seems to be taking away the food. However, having fought the stork the fisherman hears the commotion and frightens the stork away. The dog watches the stork go off to dry land and notices the moving scene of not having any food to feed the chicks. The dog is shown to have compassion and decides to leave the worms on the side of the boat for the stork to easily gather to feed the young. The stork in return brings fish to the boat so that the fisherman and indeed his dog are happy.

The simple story of sharing joy was I think found at All Saints yesterday. We listened to Nigel from Food Share, relay stories of people sharing food with those in need. Arash and his team from the hotel decided a couple of weeks ago following our Harvest service that they wanted to play their part. Arash with his family

and friends made a delicious soup that fed about 30-35 people in the Parish Centre. The people enjoyed the lunch and in turn each other's company. People who have faced and continue to face a time of struggle as Asylum Seekers and refugees found joy in helping the church to help others. They raised through the donations over £200 for Food Share.

C.S Lewis wrote 'The crown of life and the school of virtue is friendship.' Friendship multiplies joy and divides sorrow writes Bear Grylls. When we share joy with others and form friendships as we have done with our friends from Iran, we can find a new enthusiasm within community and as individuals. One of the fruits of the Holy Spirit is joy. (Galatians 5.22-23).

Verse 22 of John chapter 16 which Mrs Liz Lawn the RE teacher at Altwood uses to point out that joy can be found through sorrow. This is the affirmation of the Christian faith that Jesus giving his life on a cross leading to sorrow led to new and transformed life and the powerful affirmation of joy. Our role as people of faith is to reflect that light, to channel God's love and yes share a little joy into the world.

May we all share God's love this week,

EPISTLE 1 Thessalonians 1: 1 - 10

From Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead – Jesus, who rescues us from the wrath that is coming.

GOSPEL Matthew 22: 15 – 22

When the chief priests and Pharisees had heard the parables, they realized that Jesus was speaking about them. Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. So they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, 'Teacher, we know that you are sincere, and teach the way of God in accordance with truth, and show deference to no one; for you do not regard people with partiality. Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?' But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, 'Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the tax.' And they brought him a denarius. Then he said to them, 'Whose head is this, and whose title?' They answered, 'The emperor's.' Then he said to them, 'Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's.' When they heard this, they were amazed; and they left him and went away.
